Come to learn about Barrington buildings! Three houses, over 100 years in age, will be honored:

- 111 County Road, **James Maxwell House, 1870 et seq.** Owners: David and Susan E. Medeiros. This Late Victorian farmhouse has been extensively updated with Neo-Greek Revival detailing, a new side entry and rear addition. An inscribed clamshell found in the well dates the original construction.
- 34 Lincoln Avenue, **Hubert N. Terrell House, 1913 et seq.** Owners: Jamieson M. & Doreen B. Schiff. This dramatic Colonial Revival style house has a sweeping salt-box roof facing Lincoln Avenue. In 2005, one of Barrington's first In-law apartments was added to the original house.
- 42 Lincoln Avenue, **Arthur & L. Maude Rushton House, 1915.** Owners: Mark A. and Anne Reed Shannon. This Craftsman Style "Cube" house, an unusual style for Barrington, has a hip roof with a deep overhang, exposed rafters, and knee braces. The entrance porch has robust columns.

left its mark on the East Bay in ways that are often overlooked or ignored."
