Visit Invertebrates and an Ancient Oak at St Andrew's Farm

August 19 @ 6:30 pm - 7:30 pm

Enjoy a very special late afternoon walk with Amy O'Donnell. You will be treated to close encounters with the invertebrates we discover on our gentle meadow and woodland ramble through St Andrews Farm. You won't believe what we find! Learn about the importance of native plants, pollinators and the role of hedgerows in supporting our native wildlife – large and small. Another highlight of our walk will be a visit to an ancient oak tree.

This free event does not require advance registration. It is perfect for families. An off-road stroller should be fine. Dogs on leash are also welcome. Dress for the afternoon's weather. If it is hot, be sure to bring some water. Your favorite tick protection method is recommended as a precaution against Lyme Disease.

Directions: St Andrews Farm is located at 101 Middle Highway in Barrington. From County Rd (Route 114), turn west onto Federal Road opposite the "White Church Bridge". At the end of Federal, turn north/right onto Middle Highway and then left onto the paved driveway just beyond the soccer fields which leads to a large paved, parking area. We'll meet at the trail entrance at the corner of the parking area.

Harvest Sunset and Full Moonrise Walk

September 15 @ 6:30 pm - 8:00 pm

Experience the special moments of the changing season with a walk through Veterans Memorial Park to enjoy the sunset across Brickyard Pond and catch a rising full moon through the trees. We'll talk about night sky traditions, view successful remodeling using dark sky friendly lighting and listen for the owls.

This will be a leisurely paced walk across mostly level terrain appropriate for all ages, families and dogs on leash. Insect repellent is recommended year round as a precaution against Lyme Disease. Bring your camera and a flashlight.

Directions: The eastern side entrance of Veterans Memorial Park is off West Street. The Town/Bayside YMCA parking area is on the left, just after you cross the East Bay Bike Path. If the park gate is open, you may continue past the YMCA parking lot to a smaller parking lot 1/4 mile ahead. On the way you will pass the trailhead for the Green Trail at the double kiosk where we will meet to begin the hike.

Sunset and Hunters' Full Moonrise

October 16 @ 6:00 pm - 7:30 pm

Witness the beauty of Sowams Woods with a sunset through the woods and the full Hunter's Moon rising across Echo Lake from the Ridge Trail. With a sunset about 6:00 and a full moonrise about 6:45 pm, if the evening is clear there should be plenty of opportunities for photographs. We'll listen for owls, check the foliage of fall and learn about sky watching traditions. This will be a leisurely paced walk across rolling terrain appropriate for all ages, families and dogs on leash. Insect repellent is recommended year round as a precaution against Lyme Disease. Bring your flashlight and don't forget your camera.

Directions: Sowams Woods is located along Washington Road and South Lake Drive. Please park on Tallwood Drive, Spinnaker Drive or Lighthouse Lane. (No parking is permitted on South Lake Drive which is a one way road.) We will meet at Sowams Woods sign on Washington Rd.


