

POLICE DEPARTMENT

The Barrington Police Department is comprised of 24 sworn police officers and 6 civilian men and women who are dedicated to preserving the rights, property, safety and dignity of the people of this community. Additional police services can be found through the Department's home webpage of www.barringtonpolice.org. Since the website's inception in May 2003, almost 70,000 visitors have queried the website seeking information on the specialized services and important forms that the department provides to the community. In today's age of internet accessibility, this is one way the Department provides quicker information to the community.

UNIFORM DIVISION

Twenty-two uniformed police officers responded to approximately 15,000 calls for service, made 6,264 motor vehicle stops and checked 14,940 businesses in town during 2011.
