# TOWN OF BARRINGTON ANNUAL REPORT

## 2025 – Year in Review

### JANUARY

#### ***“Soul Force” - A Celebration of Civil Rights***

On January 18<sup>th</sup>, the community came together at the Bay Spring Community Center for an inspiring and uplifting afternoon at Soul Force: A Celebration of Civil Rights, an event that honored civil rights history while fostering a spirit of unity and reflection.

### MAY

#### ***Final Financial Town Meeting Held***

On May 28<sup>th</sup>, the Town held its last Financial Town Meeting (FTM). Starting in 2026, the budget approval process will be through an annual all-day Financial Town Referendum, based on amendments to the Town Charter approved by voters in 2024. It is a significant change for the town. According to research by Richard Staples, who moderated the 2025 FTM: “Our Town Clerk’s Office has written records of Town Meetings beginning in 1794, and the first record of a Town Meeting where fiscal matters were discussed was on June 2, 1794, at the home of Captain John Martin.”

### JUNE

#### ***Bay Spring Community Center Renovations Under Way***

Renovations to the Bay Spring Community Center started in June. A \$1.37 million grant awarded to the Town is supporting the cost of the work. The building, originally built in 1910 as a fire station, is undergoing extensive renovation of the first floor that will modernize the old apparatus bay and create a fully ADA-compliant, energy-efficient community space. This project is being funded by the American Rescue Plan Act Coronavirus Capital Projects Fund through the Governor’s Community Learning Center Municipal Grant program.

#### ***Walker Farm Launching Dock Installed***

A new ADA-accessible paddle craft launching dock at Walker Farm opened to the public in June. The installation of the dock marked the completion of the Walker Farm Recreation and Resilience Improvement project, which was funded by multiple grants and Town funds. Barrington won a 2025 [Grow Smart RI](#) award recognizing outstanding smart growth projects for the upgrades to Walker Farm.



The paddle craft launching dock at Walker Farm opened to the public in June.

### AUGUST

#### ***Sidewalk Projects Completed***

In August, construction wrapped up on a new sidewalk on Lamson Road from New Meadow Road to Martin Avenue, replacing an old asphalt walkway. In 2025, the Town’s contractor also finished the Maple Avenue-Lincoln Avenue sidewalk reconstruction project that replaced 4,000 linear feet of substandard asphalt with concrete sidewalk with new curbing, ADA-compliant ramps, crosswalks, and street trees. The project also included drainage upgrades and repaving of Maple Avenue between Walter Street and West Street.

#### ***Curbside Compost Program Launched***

Sign-ups to participate in Barrington’s Curbside Composting Pilot Program launched in August. Nearly 300 residents had enrolled as of mid-November. ### NOVEMBER

#### ***25 Watson Ave. Building Abatement and Demolition Started***

In November, a contractor began the abatement and demolition of the vacant monastery building at 25 Watson Avenue, in accordance with State and local regulations. The Town, in partnership with a developer, is

working on creating six single-family lots, a 12-unit “pocket neighborhood” on a parcel fronting on Freemont Avenue, and a public open space parcel at the site. Planning Board approval is required.

### **Flood Sensors Installed**

Flood sensors were installed in November on pilings of Town docks on the Barrington River as part of the Brown Environmental Sensing Technology Network. The technology, made possible through a grant program, will monitor water levels. The goal is to monitor water levels and provide alerts when the community is at risk of storm surge flooding.

## **WHAT'S HAPPENING IN 2026**

### **An Historic Celebration: America's 250th Anniversary.**

Barrington will join the nation in celebrating the 250th Anniversary of the United States. Festivities will continue through July 2026, bringing neighbors and friends together for family-friendly events.

**Haines Park Field Improvement Project.** The Haines Park Field Improvement Project is scheduled to wrap up in the spring. The project includes construction of a new full-size multiuse field, a rebuilt little league baseball field, improvements to an existing softball field, a new irrigation system, two new batting cages, a paved walking path, additional parking, and landscaping.

**YMCA Outdoor Pool – Resident Passes.** Under an agreement with the Town, the Bayside Y will be providing Barrington residents access to its outdoor pool through a new discounted day pass program.

**Bike and Pedestrian Facility Improvements.** The Town is moving forward with the conversion of the half mile-long closed section of South Lake Drive into a multi-use path and upgrading a path between Foote Street near Chianese Park and Lincoln Avenue. Both projects are expected to be under construction in the spring/summer of 2026.

**Barrington School Construction:** Work is expected to start at schools identified for renovations and expansion as part of the School Building Construction Project. (For more information, use the QR code to the right.)



**Athletic Fields Improvements.** The Town will be refining plans for natural turf field improvements and facility upgrades at Town sites, including the fields at Chianese.

**Bay Spring Community Center Renovations.** The newly renovated building is expected to open in the summer.

The **Fire Department** is an integral part of the public safety system in the Town and continually strives to provide a caring, courteous, and highly competent Fire/Rescue Emergency Service. The Department responds to all emergency fire and rescue calls and other emergencies including Marine Rescues, Motor Vehicle accidents, Hazardous Materials Mitigation, Ice Rescues, Lockouts, Water Emergencies, Confined Space Rescue, and Inspection Services.

## **Peck Center for Adult Enrichment and Recreation Department:**

The Peck Center for Adult Enrichment serves adults ages 50+ by offering a welcoming community space that supports social connection, lifelong learning, and emotional and physical well-being. Through daily lunches, fitness and wellness classes, arts and expression programs, organized games, and monthly educational events, the Senior Services Department provides meaningful opportunities for engagement and support.

The Recreation Department oversees the Town Beach, manages seasonal staffing, sells beach and watercraft storage passes, coordinates field and facility reservations, and delivers high-quality programming for all ages. The department hosts annual community events, runs summer camps, and offers recreational, educational, and health-focused opportunities that promote community connection and active living. resilience, and long-range planning, including the Comprehensive Plan and the Climate Action Plan; project management; Spencer Trust administration; communications and engagement, including the Town newsletter, website, and social media accounts; economic development initiatives; grant applications and administration, and more.

**Public Works** is responsible for maintenance of all Town buildings, roadways, parks, school grounds and athletic fields, sanitary sewer system including 15 pump stations, snow and ice removal from public ways, beach maintenance, street sweeping, storm drainage system and management of the refuse, recycling and yard waste contractor including operation of the recycling center and Walker Farm compost site.

**Trend:** All of the above numbers were higher compared to FY2024, including calls for service (up 35.5%), tree maintenance (up 342%), drainage (up 15.7%) and brush chipping (up 52.4%).

**Public Library:** The Library's mission is to provide free access to empowering, life-enriching knowledge, the community's hub for discovery and connection.

**Trend:** Compared to Fy2024: visits, up 2.0%; program attendance, up 20.6%; public computer use, up 15.1%; wireless sessions, up 11.1%.

**Police Department/Dispatch Center/Harbormaster:** The Police Department is authorized by the Town Council to operate with 27 sworn Officers. There are ten civilian (non-sworn) employees. Command Staff consists of the Chief of Police, a Captain, a Detective Lieutenant, an Administrative Lieutenant, and a Patrol Lieutenant. The rest of the manpower is as follows: five Uniform Sergeants, two Detectives, a School Resource Officer (SRO), and fourteen Patrol Officers spread out over three shifts providing around the clock coverage. The ten civilians include a full-time Animal Control Officer, an Administrative Assistant to the Chief, a Records/Prosecution clerk, a seasonal Harbormaster, part-time Detective Bureau clerk, and five full-time Fire / Police dispatchers. In 2024, the Police Department added a comfort dog, Levi, an English Labrador. For fiscal year 2025, there were 33,290 calls for service.



The Harbor patrol operates 7 days a week from Memorial Day until Labor Day. The patrols have become more challenging due to the number of changes to the State boating laws. The Harbor patrol spent most of the season educating kayakers and others of the new requirement of mandatory use of life jackets.

**Trend:** Calls for service increased by 6.8% in FY2025 compared to FY2024.

**The BAY Team/Barrington Prevention Coalition** is a substance use/misuse prevention coalition with a mission to promote a safe and healthy community through communication and collaboration across the lifespan.



- Drug Take Back: Partnered with Barrington Police for DEA National Drug Take Back events, collecting and disposing of 1,226.9 total pounds of unwanted, unused, and expired medications.
- Annual Liquor Training: Trained 39 retail owners, managers, and servicers in best practices for selling and serving alcohol.
- Mental Health: Trained 221 people in mental health awareness (Stronger Together, Youth Stronger Together, Columbia Suicide, Mental Health First Aid, and Aging Vibrantly Adults programs).
- Bingocize: We had over 75 participants in our Bingocize program with 18 participants in our Barrington class.

**Barrington School District:** The district has six schools, covering grades PK-12



- For the 2025-26 academic year, Barrington Public Schools is nationally recognized for being ranked #1 in the state and among the top 3 percent of school districts nationwide.
- Barrington High, Barrington Middle, Nayatt School, and Sowams School - recognized as National Blue-Ribbon Schools.
- Hampden Meadows School named a Lighthouse School in the nation by Blue Ribbon Schools of Excellence.
- RI Department of Education awarded five out of five stars for overall school performance to the Middle School, Hampden Meadows School, Nayatt School, and Sowams School. The High School and Primrose Hill School each received four stars.
- Barrington High ranked the #2 high school in Rhode Island.
- Barrington Middle ranked the #1 middle school in the state.
